Rebecca Williams. (2022). <u>Climb Smarter: Mental Skills and Techniques</u> for <u>Climbing</u>. Sequoia Books. Aimed at recreational rock-climbers but with plenty of advice for coaches too, Climb Smarter translates evidence-based approaches into practical exercises for improving climbers' headgames. Written by a consultant clinical psychologist, the book looks at common performance issues in climbers through the lenses of Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT) and Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), in an easily digestible format. With case studies to illustrate the key themes of each chapter, questions to reflect on, and drills to work through, the book covers goal setting and habit change, anxiety in all its different forms, as well as the typical mental skills toolkit but adapted specifically for climbers.


